Blenheim is fast becoming our home and we are extremely happy here. The commute home is so quick, we are loving the change from the busyness of Christchurch. Weekends we spend getting to know Blenheim and what is has to offer and Sundays are usually spent at "church" (riding our Harley Davidsons as our friends refer to it (3)).

My husband Philip has recently started at Bethsaida in the newly developed role of Electrical Service Technician. This being his qualification, we are fortunate enough to have his skills and experience in repairing, servicing and maintaining our electrical equipment, hoists, hospital beds etc.

We have been busy over the past weeks preparing for our certification audit which was completed earlier this month. You may have noticed that there are Māori words to identify different rooms and areas around the facility and that our *Health and Disability Code Of Rights* posters are in both English and Te Reo. This is a relatively new requirement of the Health and Disability Sector Standards. I also try to make the effort to greet staff in their native language when possible.

Unfortunately COIVD has hit our Residents and Staff hard again and we have launched straight into "Isolation mode". Staff are working tirelessly, following the infection control protocols and caring for our loved Residents and each other. We have had many Residents and staff affected which has put an added strain on the facility but the team is working well to get us through.

This has also meant that we have had to cancel many of our special activity events that we had planned, due to wings being in isolation and staff being utilised for other tasks around the facility.

We are now very fortunate to have 11 Registered Nurses in our Team, with the most recent arrival being Mary Antonette who has joined us from Singapore. She is settling in well and has hit the ground running with orientation, certification audit and now COVID in the facility.

Staffing has been a great concern to many facilities in our industry and we have all been working hard to recruit the right people to care for our elderly and your loved ones. I have been working with Immigration since November 2022 and my efforts are finally being rewarded with 7 new staff having recently joined us and another 2 yet to arrive in New Zealand. We are very lucky to have them and encourage you to welcome the new faces you will see when you visit. For some of our new staff, this is the first time in New Zealand or away from their own country so it must be a very anxious time for them and anything we can do to make them feel more comfortable and at home will be appreciated I am sure. They all appear to be settling in well so far and are assets to our facility.

This month will see the visit of my Mum from New Plymouth where she lives in a Retirement Village. It will be her first visit to us since we moved to Blenheim so we are looking forward to showing her our new home and a little of Blenheim. We also have tickets to the Priscilla show coming up in Blenheim this month, so we are both looking forward to that.

We have had our daughter Maysha and granddaughter Ariana from Christchurch for a visit over Easter. It was really great to spend time with them. Unfortunately they are now both suffering from COVID for the first time.

Philip and I were thrilled to host a baby shower for Steph before she went on maternity leave and help celebrate Lexi's 4th birthday at the Grandeza house with a special cake I made for Miss Lexi. 


